

Widow & Orphan Care Ukraine – Spring 2006



Present Realities: The Dnipropetrovs'k (region/state) of Ukraine has a population of 3.5 million people. The region is located east of the Ukrainian capital of Kiev in the central part of the country.

This region was especially hard hit by the collapse of the Soviet Union. Many of the heavy industries and factories found themselves ill equipped to compete in a world economy. The huge state run farms and factories have failed to produce as equipment and technology have fallen into serious disrepair.

Crops go unharvested and yields continue to decline due to poor soil management and lack of equipment, in affect causing many Ukrainian people to plunge into poverty.

Ukrainians have been greatly affected since gaining their freedom in 1991. The communist system promised their workers that they would be able to retire with a pension, but now that the government is gone so is their pension. This has caused children whose families are unable to provide for them to be abandoned, and forced the elderly into the streets to beg for food and money.

Plan of Action:

The plan is to facilitating a short term mission's team of 7-10 men and women from Eden Mennonite to provide food, medical supplies, and distribute pre shipped clothing for people in the Dnipropetrovs'k region. The team will be visiting small villages and orphanages to invest into their lives by providing them with some of the essentials for life.

- Providing heat for the homes of 60 families.
- Purchasing food supplies to put together 200 food hampers containing sugar, flour, macaroni, rice, and cooking oil which will feed one person for 1 month (approx. \$12 per person.)
- Purchasing prescription drugs for 150 people who have been examined by a local Christian doctor. Also providing financial assistance for those who cannot afford their hospital bills (approx. \$15 per person.)
- Purchasing hygiene supplies to put together 200 hygiene hampers containing detergent, shampoo, soap, toothbrush, and toothpaste. (approx. \$8 per person)
- Providing 3 feeding programs in three different locations in which the 200 food boxes will be distributed after the meal.
- Shipping and distributing clothing.

Positive Benefits:

We will demonstrate and communicate the love of the Father to the orphaned and widowed by providing for their basic needs. We will be improving the health and general wellbeing of the neglected widows, and children by providing them with food, clothing, and compassionate care. As well, to encouraging local Christians in the area by sharing Christ's love for them through the simple but affective act of fellowship.
