Assisting the victims of hurricane Katrina



Since January, 2006

- Assisted house building jobs for 450 families

With the remaining funds initially raised, funds were sent to Christian Life Center who is the last remaining Church continuing to provide a place for volunteers assisting victims of Hurricane Katrina.

Due to the number of volunteers still going through the camp it was essential that new and additional kitchen equipment was purchased to continue providing food for workers.



Relief Aid: Camp Katrina Kitchen Equipment

- 3 Refrigerators
- 1 Grill
- 2 Freezers
- 2 gas ovens & stove tops

With over 4,000 volunteers, Camp Katrina currently averages between 1 & 3 teams of 6 to 10 people every week.

Camp Katrina

We are currently feeding volunteers, of which we have on any given week anywhere from 10 – 50. We have had over approximately 4,000 volunteers since Hurricane Katrina between our old camp in the K-Mart parking lot and our new camp in the NAPA building. We are currently trying to purchase a new building which will house 48 volunteers, which with the bi-focus we have now (rebuilding homes and spiritual) 40-50 people is about the max we are trying to house to be able to focus on both and do a good job on both. This equipment will also be used for community outreach outside of our volunteer scope. Ie: things like thanksgiving dinner for the community we have relationships with and other future events such as this. We are excited to have kitchen equipment inside of our building.
